Dino, Won't You Blow Your Horn?

Scientists are singing a happy tune after finding a new species of dinosaur in [Mexico](#).

The plant-eating hadrosaur lived about 72 million years ago. It was at least 25 feet long and had a large hollow bulge on top of its skull, through which it probably breathed.

"The really cool thing about these duck-billed dinosaurs is that their nasal passages probably allowed them to make some kind of music," like a trumpet, said Terry Gates, a paleontologist at the [Utah Museum of Natural History](#).
