

# **FIRE PREVENTION ORDER – SE UTAH RIVER CORRIDORS**

United States Department the Interior  
Bureau of Land Management  
Order No. UTY002-10-001

Pursuant to regulations of the Department of Interior, 43 CFR 9212 the following acts are prohibited on the area, roads, and trails, described below until rescinded by the Price, Monticello, Moab Field Office(s), Bureau of Land Management:

1. Setting, building, maintaining, attending, or using open fire of any kind (including charcoal) except as otherwise authorized. Devices fueled by petroleum or liquid propane gas (LPG) products are allowed in all locations.
2. Smoking, except within an enclosed vehicle, camp trailer, or building, or while stopped in an area at least three feet in diameter that is barren or cleared to mineral soil.
3. Discharging, or using any kind of fireworks, tracer ammunition, or other incendiary devices in any location on federal lands. (Note that these acts are always prohibited on federal lands.)
4. Operating a motorcycle, chainsaw, ATV, or other types of small engines without an approved and working spark arrester.

## **The following persons are exempt from the order:**

All other fire restrictions, or necessary exemptions to the restrictions, will be handled through local “permits” issued by the responsible agency(ies) for that purpose.

## **Area Description:**

All **BLM** administered lands from the Colorado/Utah border, to Canyonlands National Park that are within ¼ mile of the Colorado River. All **BLM** administered lands from Swasey’s Beach down to Canyonlands National Park that are within ¼ mile of the Green River. All **BLM** administered lands from Bluff to Glen Canyon National Recreation Area that are within ¼ mile of the San Juan River.

This order is effective 12:00 a.m., 2nd day of July 2010 and will remain in effect until rescinded.

Individuals violating this order can be subject to fines and associated fire suppression and rehabilitation costs. 43 CFR 9212.4

### **Fire Restrictions To Be Implemented In Southeastern Utah**

Utah ... The Bureau of Land Management (BLM) and Utah State Division of Forestry, Fire and State Lands (DFFSL) have implemented fire restrictions on three major river ways. The hot and dry weather has dried vegetation and raised fire potential.

The river corridors that will be under fire restriction include; the Green River (from Swasey Beach to Canyonlands National Park), the Colorado River (from the Colorado/Utah border to Canyonlands National Park) and the San Juan River (from Bluff to Glen Canyon National Recreation Area).

The following acts are prohibited on the area, roads, and trails, described below until rescinded by the BLM and DFFSL.

1. Setting, building, maintaining, attending, or using open fire of any kind (including charcoal) except as otherwise authorized. Devices fueled by petroleum or liquid propane gas (LPG) products are allowed in all locations.
2. Smoking, except within an enclosed vehicle, camp trailer, or building, or while stopped in an area at least three feet in diameter that is barren or cleared to mineral soil.
3. Discharging, or using any kind of fireworks, tracer ammunition, or other incendiary devices in any location on federal lands. (Note that these acts are always prohibited on federal lands.)
4. Operating a motorcycle, chainsaw, ATV, or other types of small engines without an approved and working spark arrester.

All other fire restrictions, or necessary exemptions to the restrictions, will be handled through local "permits" issued by the responsible agency(ies) for that purpose.

This order does not apply to those lands administered by the National Park Service.

This order is effective 12:00 a.m., 2nd day of July 2010 and will remain in effect until rescinded.
